TFRI ASM ABSTRACT GUIDELINES

When submitting abstracts, **you must use the abstract template** document and adhere to the following guidelines:

Format

1. Word document format, **12 point Calibri, 1" margins, single spacing** and **no more than one page** in length (less than **350** words).
2. The file name of your document must be labelled with your full name (first and last) and your registration ID: smith_jane_1234.docx.
3. The title should be brief and reflect the content of the abstract. It should be in upper case letters only.
4. Please indicate the presenter in bold font when listing authors and affiliations.
5. Abbreviations may be used if standard or if spelled out and defined at first use.
6. Supplementary data will not be accepted.
7. If space permits, one major reference may be included.

Organization

Please include, and indicate **in bold**, the following **six** parts of your abstract:

1. **Introduction:** One or two sentences (maximum) indicating the purpose of the study.
2. **Method:** A brief description of pertinent, experimental procedures.
3. **Results:** A summary of your research results.
4. **Conclusion(s):** Please provide a statement of the main conclusions. Conclusions must be supported by your results and summarized within your abstract at the time of submission.
5. **Outcome / Impact:** A statement on the (potential) impact of the research on cancer patients (if applicable).
6. **Keywords:** A list of up to **four keywords** applicable to your abstract. For example:
Keywords: prostate cancer, Hsp27, castrate-resistant, Hippo pathway

Selection Criteria

Submitted abstracts will be assessed by a committee and acceptance will be based on:

- Scientific excellence and impact
- Submission is by first author only
- Data is current and relevant
- Conclusions/findings are clearly stated
- Abstract relates to a Terry Fox program or project
- A balance of representation from all TFRI projects/programs
