

Nizar Jacques Bahlis, MD

Dr. Nizar Jacques Bahlis is an associate professor in the departments of Hematology and Oncology and a member of the Arnie Charbonneau Cancer Institute, Cumming School of Medicine, University of Calgary. He is also an oncologist with Alberta Health Services. Dr. Bahlis received his medical degree from St Joseph University – French Faculty of Medicine in Beirut, Lebanon. He completed his internal medicine residency at the State University of New York in Syracuse, followed by a hematology-oncology fellowship at the University of Miami, FL. He also completed a postdoctoral fellowship in cancer biology at the University of Miami.

Dr. Bahlis' laboratory research focuses on the study of the disorders of plasma cells, with particular interest in multiple myeloma genomics, mechanisms of drug resistance and the development of novel therapeutics. He has received several awards and research funding from numerous agencies, including the ASCO Young Investigator Award, the Multiple Myeloma Research Foundation, The Leukemia and Lymphoma Society of Canada, the Terry Fox Foundation, the National Institutes of Health, and the Canadian Institutes of Health Research. His research has been published in many peer-reviewed journals, including the New England Journal of Medicine, The Lancet, Blood, Molecular Cancer Research, and Clinical Cancer Research.
